Dear Friends:

For the eighth year in a row, the Washington Post named CRSM one of “America’s Most Challenging High Schools,” ranking us in the top 4% of all secondary schools in the U.S.! We have come a long way since our founding in 2004, and I am proud to have been an active part of the rapid growth of the school over the last eight years.

Our students continue to outperform their peers in key academic metrics. Most importantly, CRSM alumni are completing college at more than six times the rate for low-income students and nearly two times the rate for the general population. ## Students Study Hamilton and Attend a Performance



In conjunction with the Gilder Lehrman Institute’s Hamilton Education Program, 48 CRSM students earned an invitation to a performance of *Hamilton* and a private Q&A with members of the cast. It was the culmination of six weeks of work by CRSM students who studied American history through a special integrated curriculum. Jocelyn Rubi ‘19 was one of twelve chosen to perform her original work on stage in front of select cast members based on the classroom studies.



### Winning Awards at the Daley Center

For the last several years, CRSM has been a top competitor at the Howlett Cup Mock Trial Competition held at the Daley Center. Teams from Chicago’s Top Catholic high schools contend for the Cup including: Fenwick, Loyola Academy, Christ the King Jesuit High School, Mt. Carmel, Cristo Rey Jesuit High School (Pilsen) and St. Ignatius College Prep.

This year, our Cristo Rey St. Martin lawyers-to-be turned in their strongest performance ever - winning Best Defense Attorney, Best Witness and taking overall honors for second place. When asked how she won Best Attorney, Raneer Sanford, ‘19 answered, “I was told that my repeated emphasis on reasonable doubt was one of the reasons I was recognized.”

### 39 Colleges Visit CRSM First Annual College Fair

Because of the demands of the Work Study Program and a rigorous academic curriculum, CRSM students work within tight schedules, often finding the college search process challenging – and expensive. To help alleviate these time and financial burdens, Cristo Rey St. Martin began its own College Fair, welcoming 39 colleges and universities from around the country to the CRSM campus. With coaching from the College Counseling Department, juniors and seniors were well prepared to meet and impress more college representatives than ever before.

CRSM college counselor Beth Kainic noted, *"I wish we had more resources to take our students to college campuses - there is nothing like stepping onto a campus, but the College Fair is the next best thing."*

## Challenges Became Her Fuel

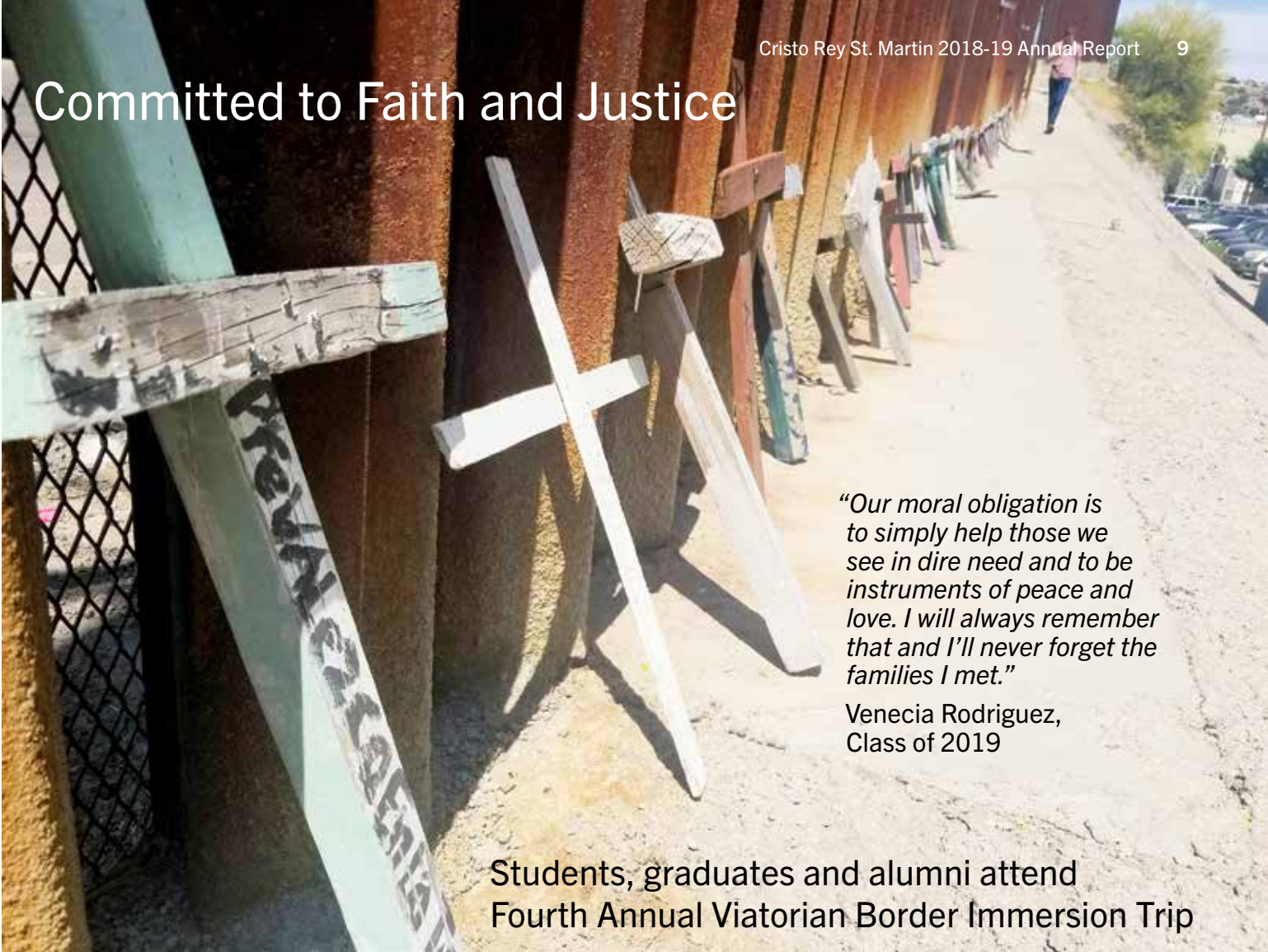
## Coming Back to Give Back

### Note on the Cornerstone Campaign

Since 2015, Cristo Rey St. Martin College Prep has been raising funds for its Cornerstone Campaign. The \$28,500,000 Cornerstone Campaign is designed to finance the acquisition and construction of a new campus in Waukegan, Illinois, along with funding operational needs through 2019–2020. To accelerate occupancy, the School's Board of Trustees approved a strategy that separated the Cornerstone Campaign into phases. The first phase included property acquisition and renovation/build-out of approximately 57,000 square feet. The first phase was completed on February 13, 2018 when the School held its first day of classes in the new campus. The School spent approximately \$17,900,000 on the first phase of the new campus, including land, renovation costs, and the costs of necessary furniture, fixtures and equipment.

The strategy for the second phase of the Campaign contemplates a variety of improvements, including space for a gymnasium and fitness center, prayer space, and a Galleria. In addition, the second phase contemplates land acquisition of adjacent properties for future uses, such as athletic fields and outdoor environmental science labs. Plans for the second phase will require more funds than initially anticipated when the Cornerstone Campaign was developed. Pledges outstanding at June 30, 2019 will be used to fund annual operating deficits as necessary. Additional proceeds from outstanding pledges will be used to kick-start the second phase of the Cornerstone Campaign.

\* Partial funding for our new campus was raised through participation in the New Markets Tax Credits (NMTC) program. This program created temporary notes receivable and payable, both of which will be eliminated after the seven year tax credit period that is customary under the program. The cash held in the building reserve will be used for the completion of the new campus and for future building needs.
