

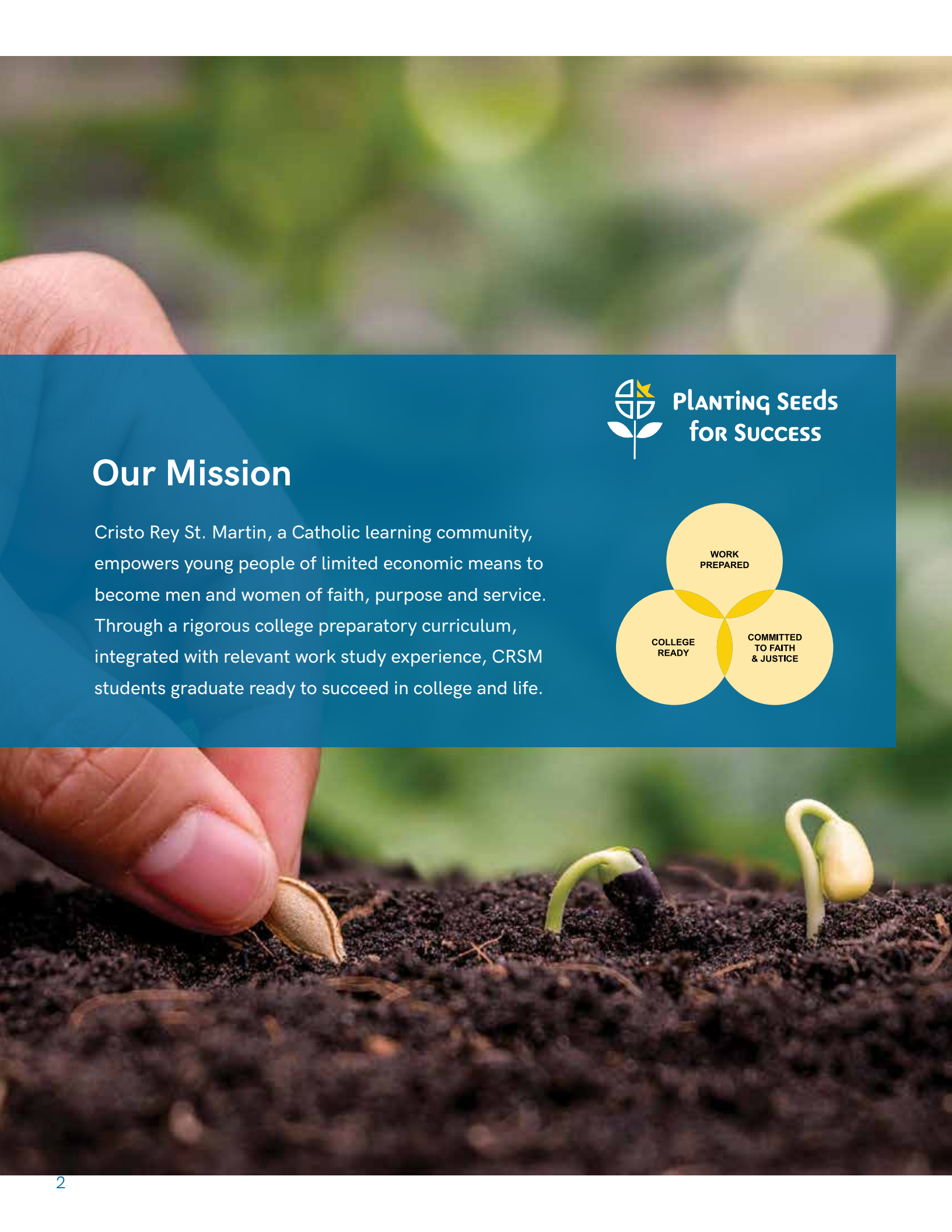

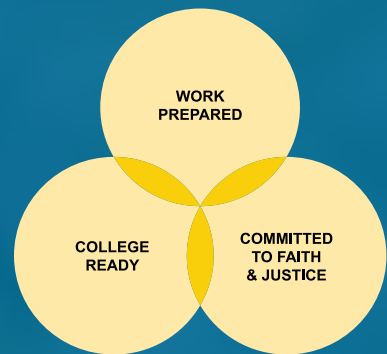

Dear friends of CRSM,

These lines from Ken Untener's prayer inspired us to choose *Planting Seeds for Success* as the theme for our 2022 Annual Report:

We water seeds already planted,
knowing that they hold future promise."*

Seeds are the ultimate metaphor for hope – young and full of potential – and a fitting symbol for our students. Cristo Rey St. Martin is a community of donors, business partners, faculty, staff, alumni, and friends who create the ecosystem where our students flourish. Our young people are our future. With proper care and nurturing, they will grow to their full potential, but it doesn't happen overnight. However more than 50% of all new bachelor's degrees being earned by Pell Grant eligibility in our area belong to CRSM alumni.** This year's Annual Report illustrates how **CRSM students** and alumni are blossoming despite so much uncertainty and how they are **using their God-given talents to make the world better.**

Our success has always been a team effort – a collective success resulting from the hard work and generosity of so many people, including you! We simply cannot do it alone. Even though you are not physically in the hallways and classrooms on a daily basis, you are with us in spirit. **Your support is more important than ever!** You help us continue and extend our mission.

Corporate Work Study Program Successfully Adapts to the Changing Work Place

Cristo Rey St. Martin College Prep is known for its rigorous college preparatory curriculum. CRSM students also participate in a unique work study program that gives them real-life work experience that helps drive these impressive stats.

Always innovating, CRSM has had to adjust during the COVID-19 pandemic and devise new ways for its students to work. It wasn't easy, but we adapted to remote, then back-to-the-office and hybrid work schedules successfully.

As the pandemic shutdown unfolded across the country, and many businesses went remote, CRSM pivoted to make sure that all of its students were placed in jobs. That took creative thinking, including **proactively recruiting area foundations and nonprofits to partner as job sponsors.** The results speak to the success of the program.

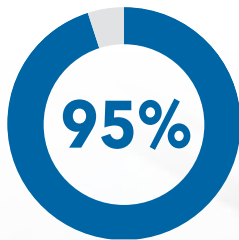

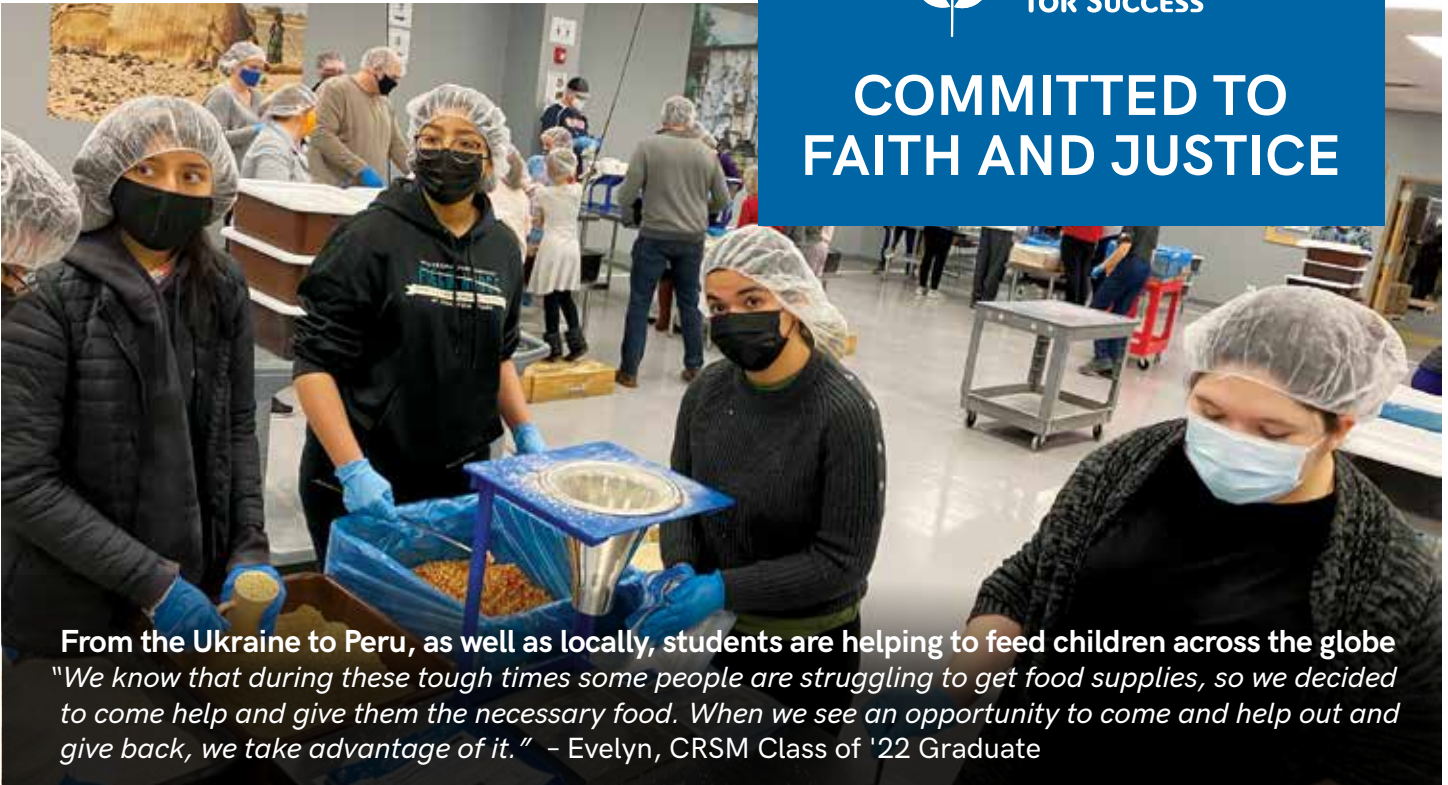

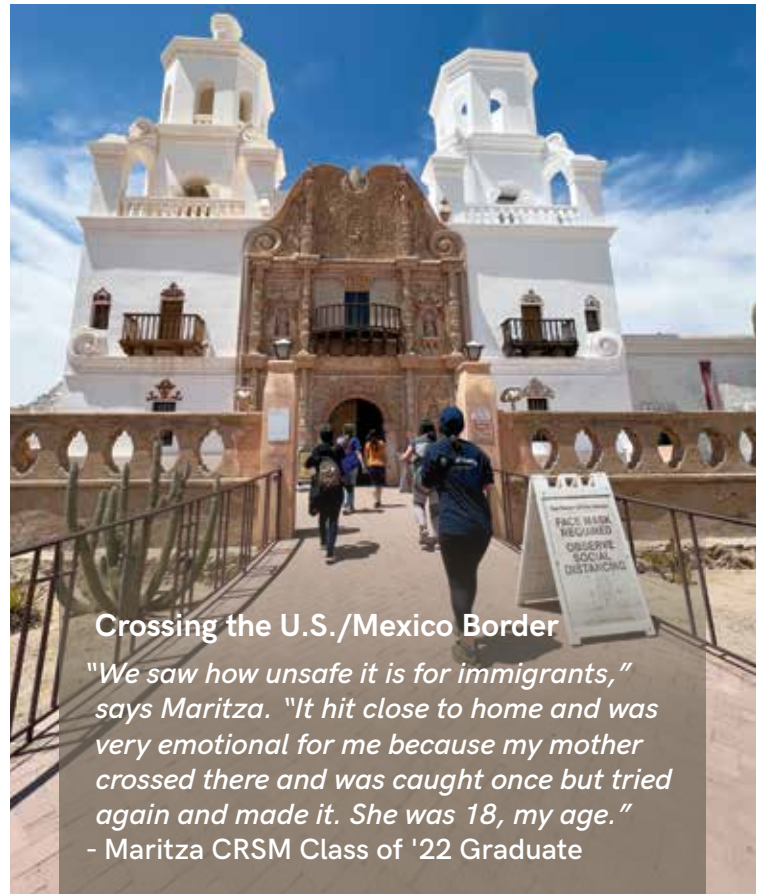


Students' trek to South Dakota Indian reservation sparks reflection on Identity, value, and legacy

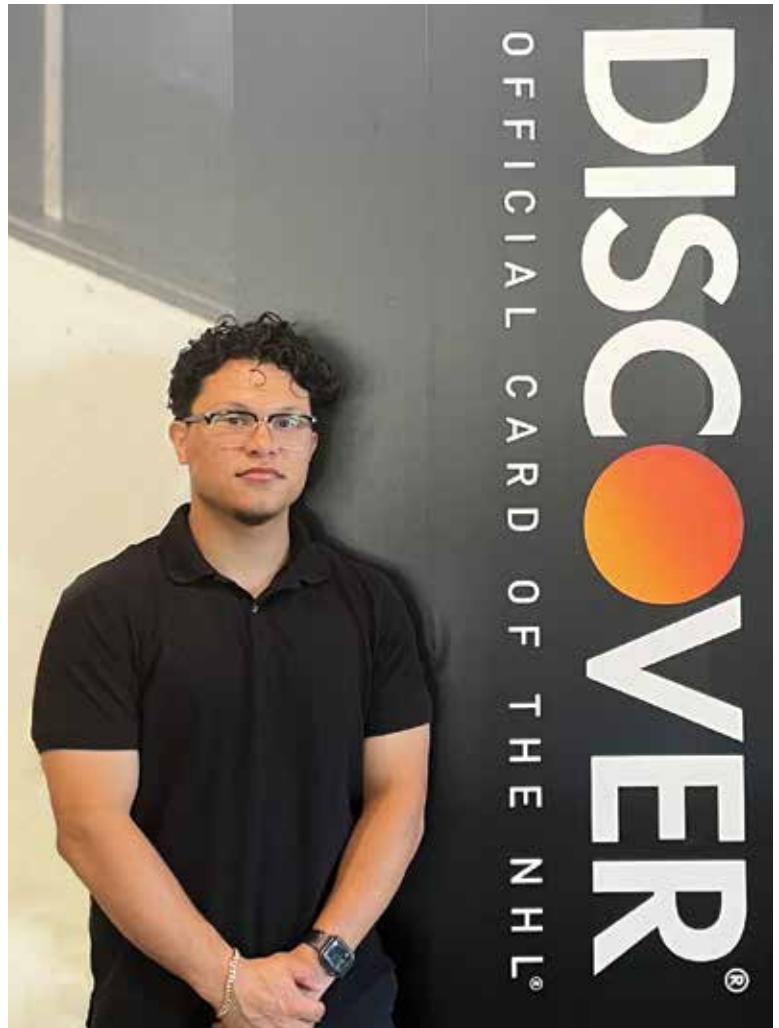

Work Study Program Helps Alum Discover and Inspire Career Path

At the intersection of psychology and business, **Oscar Gonzalez, Class of '17 alum** used his time on campus at **The College of Holy Cross** in Worcester, MA to further his academic studies and learn the kinds of skills—tenacity, patience, collaboration—that he hopes will drive his success.

"I want to use my degree to make the world a better place," says Gonzalez, an **Accounts Payable Analyst at Discover Financial Services** in Riverwoods. In 2021, Oscar earned his bachelor's degree in psychology from The College of Holy Cross in Worcester, MA. He started working at Discover his junior year in high school through the Corporate Work Study Program and has worked summers and holidays during the last five years until he was hired full-time last January, after obtaining his bachelor's degree.

The first person to attend college in his family, the North Chicago 23-year-old said he was inspired during his four years at CRSM to serve others and give back to the community. Initially he sought to become a physician, but now is using his psychology studies paired with the Certificate of Business Fundamentals he studied for at Holy Cross to *"mentor students to be successful at work, but also to be good human beings."* At Discover, **he's a mentor to 27 CRSM students who work in the work study program.** He's also volunteered to mentor students at CRSM.

A varsity soccer player during his four years at CRSM, Gonzalez played on the Holy Cross Soccer Club and was an avid volunteer there for groups advocating for minority rights.

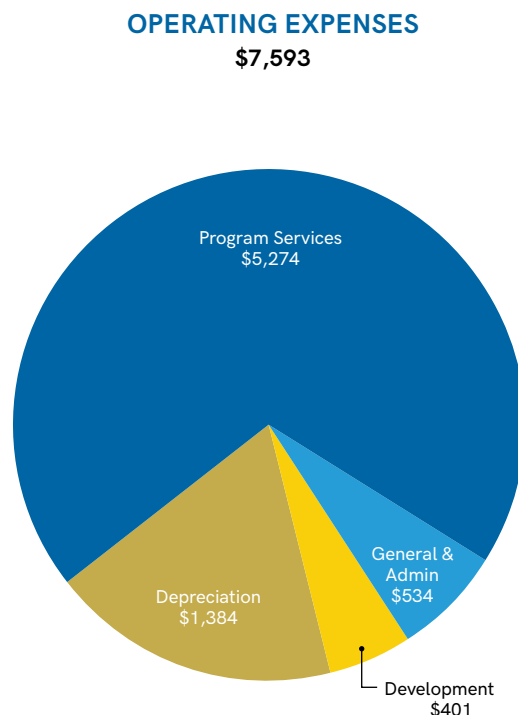
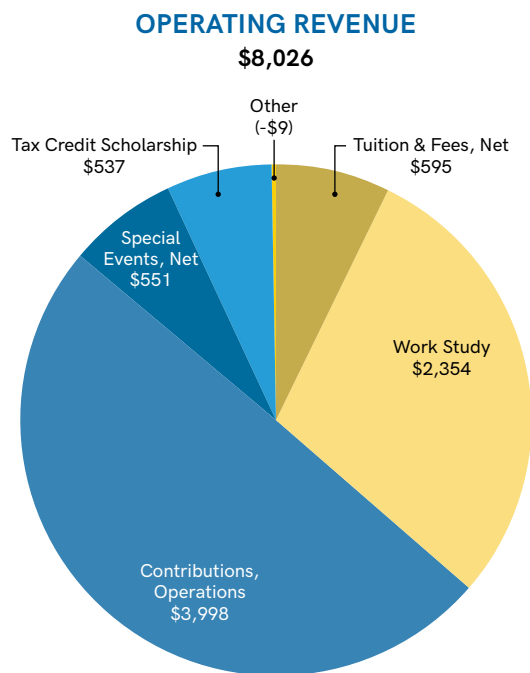


OPERATING REVENUE AND EXPENSES

Illinois Tax Credit Scholarship Program Contributions

CELEBRATING A LIFE WELL-LIVED: NEW SCHOLARSHIP HONORS CRSM ADVISOR FR. JOHN MILTON, CSV OF THE VIATORIAN COMMUNITY

For more than 10 years, Fr. John Milton, CSV, generously shared his vast knowledge in physics and became a spiritual companion to the CRSM community. In September 2022 he would have celebrated 70 years as a Viatorian and 65 years as a priest. He passed away Jan. 24 at the age of 92.

To celebrate and honor Fr. Milton's legacy, the **Clerics of St. Viator created a college scholarship fund for a CRSM graduate seeking to pursue a career in the STEM field. The Fr. John Milton Scholarship was presented for the first time at the Class of 2022 graduation in June.** Graduate Ezequiel J. is the first recipient of the scholarship and plans to major in mechanical engineering at the University of Illinois.

A retired physics professor at De Paul University and founding member of the science staff at Saint Viator High School in Arlington Heights, **Fr. Milton commuted for more than 10 years to Waukegan to serve as advisor to Kumkum Bonnerjee, physics teacher.** In recognition of his service, the CRSM physics lab is named in his honor.
