Dear friends of CRSM,

The theme for this year's annual report is Writing New Chapters. High school is just the opening paragraph for young people as they journey into adulthood, composing the stories of their lives. Our students and alumni are

writing new chapters for themselves, their families, and their community; creating new storylines as the first in their families to attend college and pursue professional careers while also honoring the narratives of their parents who have been integral to bringing them this far.

Our students' stories are full of dramatic and positive plot twists in the face of many challenges. With dropout rates at area public high schools close to 40%, CRSM students are staying in school and continuing to college. Of all the students who started with us in ninth grade for the Class of 2023, 96% graduated this Spring. That is a record high for

CRSM and the highest retention rate ever recorded for any Cristo Rey school ever. For the fourth year in a row, 100% of our senior class was accepted to at least one bachelor's program.

Writing is hard work. It doesn't happen overnight, and it doesn't happen alone. Our success has always been a team effort - a collective success resulting from the hard work and generosity of so many people, including you! We couldn't have come this far alone, and we can't continue our mission without you.

Your support is more important than ever! Even though you are not physically in the hallways and classrooms on a daily basis, you are with us in spirit. You help us continue and extend our mission to more and more young people. By supporting our students, their families, and our community; you help in Writing New Chapters full of promise and hope for brighter futures. Thank you!

Greetings from our Chairman of the Board



Dear friends of CRSM,

It is a pleasure for us to provide you with this year's annual report and present you with important updates on the success of the school, and the many ways that we help our students, and their families write impactful

chapters in their lives. From our modest beginnings in 2004, the school has graduated over 1,160 students who have gone on to lead productive lives and who are able to build families and pursue career opportunities that otherwise would not have been available to them without your support.

Over the last several years, CRSM has been writing new chapters of progress, including the completion of our new campus. The new facility was completed in two phases, first with state-of-the-art classrooms and common areas, and next with the addition of a gymnasium and additional classroom capacity. This year we will turn yet another new page by adding a world class soccer field adjacent to the main building. The field should be completed in time to be used for the 2023-2024 school year and will further enhance our student experience and be an asset for the community.

In addition to the improvements to our facilities, our exceptional teaching staff and committed administrative team has been focused on advancing academic performance. Retention of students from ninth grade to graduation was 96% in 2023, our highest ever, and the best among Cristo Rey chapters nationally. Advanced Placement class enrollments have more than doubled over the last five years. And for the last four years, 100% of our graduates have been accepted into a four-year bachelor's degree program. While these results are impressive, we have more work to do. Too many of our graduates who are accepted into four-year degree programs are unable to graduate from college due to financial circumstances or other challenges. This is a key area of focus for the Board and our leadership as we write future chapters in the success of CRSM over the coming months and years.

On behalf of the Board of Trustees, our students, and our staff, I extend our most sincere thanks for your continued support in our mission to develop talented young individuals who are work prepared, college ready, and committed to faith and justice. Your generosity continues to make a clear and tangible impact on the lives of our students, their families, and our community.

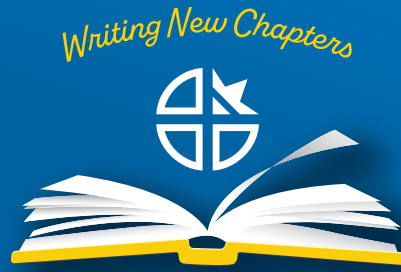
Waukegan Symphony Orchestra Performs a Community Event at CRSM

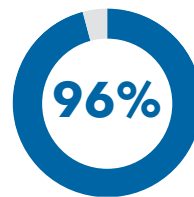

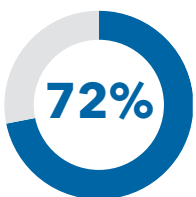

Illinois Tax Credit Scholarship Program Contributions

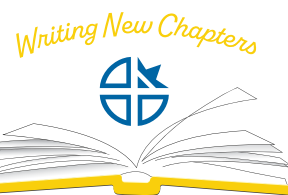

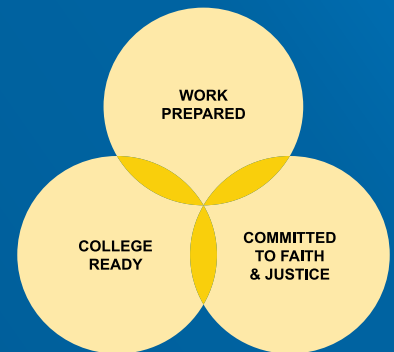
